Anandi Ramamurthy is a Senior Lecturer at the School of Journalism Media and Communication, University of Central Lancashire. Her publications include *Imperial Persuaders: Images of African and Asian People in British Advertising* (Manchester University Press, 2003); *Visual Culture and Decolonisation in Britain* (co-edited with Simon Faulkner, Ashgate, 2006). She is currently completing a book on Asian Youth Movements in Britain.

In the 1970s and 1980s as part of a broader anti-racist movement, Asian Youth Movements emerged in many towns and cities in Britain. These were children of migrants from South Asia who had grown up in the UK. While their parents had been forced to accept menial jobs with low wages as new migrants, the next generation was not prepared to accept the life that their parents had led.
