Greetings From the Oldest President of the League

Ms. Bushra Al – Hoss

Boushra was born in Beirut in 1911...just three years before the start of World War I. Thanks God, she is in good health and doing well...well enough to play piano before her visitors.

Actually, Mrs. Hasna Barakat and I were honored to pay her a visit at her Verdun home on Saturday, the 4th. of April to learn a lot about her. She finished her education at the American School for Girls which was known as ASG and taught at Al-Makassed School for 12 consecutive years.

During the second World War II, Bushra joined the Women's League and Child Welfare organization as a member and could maintain her membership for 50 years. Also, she was a member of AUB Village Welfare. They used to camp during summer in AKKAR to teach the illiterates how to read and write. In the said three entities, Bushra rendered her best services in the volunteer work. During the war they used to help in hospitals and taking care of needy people. Bushra still remembers Mrs. Dodge who was the president of the League at that period; particularly her famous statement: [Ladies, you are "BUSY BEES"].

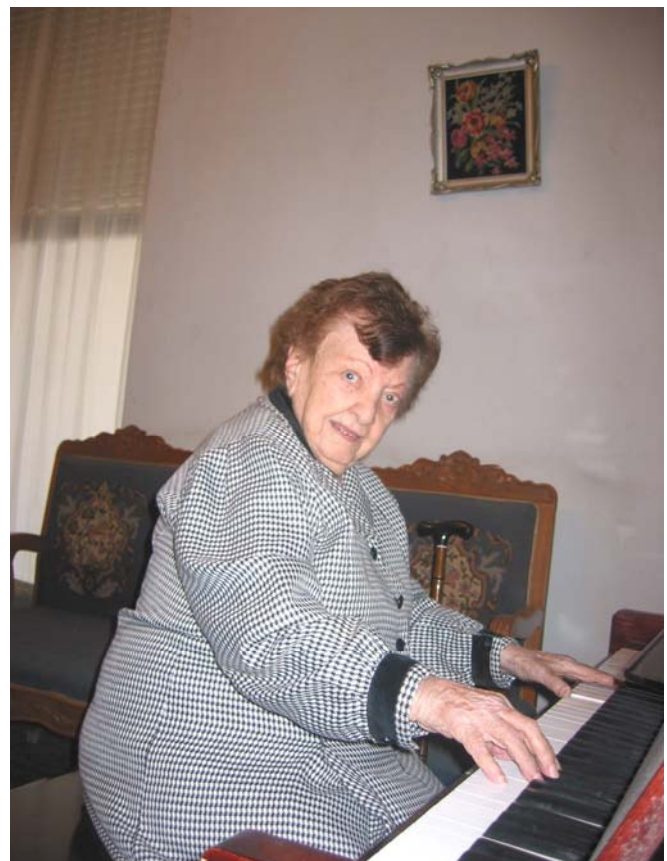
