WL Grows Concern Towards AUB Handicapped Students

In the past, the Women's League had the tradition of helping certain societies by donating whatever money remaining by the end of each year. WL resources have always been coming only from membership fees, trips, Christmas activities and Mother's Day celebration.

Then, a valuable suggestion was given by the WL President 1997-1999 Mrs. Nabiha Younis. In her term as president coincided with the "Year of the Handicapped". She suggested establishing a fund for the benefit of handicapped students. The suggestion was relayed to Dr. John Waterbury (AUB President at the time) that the League establishes a scholarship fund for the benefit of handicapped students at AUB. He applauded the idea and the League continued to contribute substantially to this fund ever since, thanks to the enthusiastic support of all The WL members.

April 2011 Trip to Tripoli

A trip to the city of Tripoli in northern Lebanon was organized for the members of the League and their friends on Wednesday, April 13, 2011 by Mrs. Jaqueline Kassis, the trip chairperson. This trip aroused great interest in around 90 ladies, which required the presence of two buses.

Upon arrival to Tripoli, the ladies were warmly received and welcomed by Mrs. Jinan Mbayed Skaff of Azm & Saade Association which is located in Bab El Ramel. The founders Taha and Najib Mikati named the association after their parents Azmi Taha Mikati and Souad Abdallah Ghandour honoring them in 1988.

Mrs. Skaff invited the ladies to a rich and fancy breakfast, then took them to a tour in the building where we had the chance to meet the handicapped and the blind who are good at making different shapes of soaps, candles and sewing stuff. All the ladies made it a point to buy their products for encouragement. One of the blinds played violin and sang for Fairuz and his performance was fantastic.

Mrs. Skaff showed us also Al Hammam Al Jadid which is by far the largest bath in the city of Tripoli and which was built between 1722 and 1730 by Ibrahim Pacha, the Ottoman governor of the city, on the remains of a Mamaluke building, and was called the New bath. The dome with pierced glass covered openings, bringing light to the interior. In the Southern wall of Al Hammam, there is a Mamaluke fountain.

The next move was made towards Nawfal Palace (Rachid Karame Cultural Center) which was built in 1898 for the Nawfal family. It became a municipality cultural center in 1970 and now it is used for hosting seminars and some exhibitions. Then we proceeded to Bkeftine Monastery, which took 100 years to build it [1750-1850] which included schools and universities.

- 1- In 1780 the first university in Lebanon the “Bkeftine University for Law,” was founded. It is worth mentioning that Mr. Abdel Hamid Karameh, Mr. Suleiman Freinjeih and Sheikh Rachid Rida and other important personalities graduated from the said university as lawyers.
- 2- A school for the Village
- 3- Wahat Al Farah founded for students with special needs.

In 1978, during the civil war, the whole monastery was stolen and a Polish group will try to renovate it. At the end of the journey the ladies enjoyed their lunch at Al Chate’ al Feddi at Al Mina.

The trip is planned and organized by Mrs. Jaquelin Kassis for the Women’s League and their friends. The destination is Al Beka’ Al- Gharbi passing through Chtoura – German School Schneller to have breakfast.
