



## **AUB featured in leading German academic magazine**

Germany's leading academic magazine DAVO Nachrichten has featured an article about AUB in its latest issue. The article described AUB's faculty, courses, location, architecture, and activities pointing out that many renowned experts in all fields graduated from AUB and that Yahoo!'s homepage listed it among 15 American universities that offer "fantastic higher education values."

The magazine included pictures of AUB's landmark buildings, its campus, and various facilities, such as the ultra-modern track-and-field, the private beach, and the tennis courts. It talked about the green cover of the campus and its historic buildings such as AUB's Archaeological Museum and its outstanding collections.

The article's author, Barbara Schumacher, also highlighted AUB's important contribution to its neighborhood, in business and culture.

She also described the almost spontaneous use by students of Arabic, French and English words in one sentence.

The writer also listed international speakers who gave lectures at AUB, such as Dr. Christian E. Loeben, curator of the permanent Egyptian Exhibition in the Kestner Museum in Hannover. She briefly told the history of the country with particular emphasis on the architecture.

Relating the University's input to the city, the journalist reported on the Women's League humanitarian association which was founded in 1919 by a group of women, among whom was the grandmother of the current president of the AUB Peter F. Dorman.

DAVO Nachrichten is a journal of German and Middle East studies, and it includes publications, research projects, internet news, reviews, and presentations of institutions engaged in Middle East studies. It publishes two issues per year, each up to 150 pages, with more than half of the text in English and French.
