Strategic Challenges

- RCODE program needs to develop a strategy for providing an exchange program with international universities working in the field of rural development.
- RCODE, through its coordinator, has been implementing and will keep working on a strategy to secure scholarship options for graduate students, in partnership with private and public stakeholders.
- Since there has been an increase in student's enrollment in RCODE program in the last 2 years, it is recommended to have a full-time officer (RA) for the program.

- The program will benefit from participation of external experts and leading scholars in the field of rural development, which needs to be applied in the coming academic years, with an increase in the operating budget. It would also benefit from an increase in funding for students fieldwork activities that will help the program start developing an initial documentation of rural development challenges and case studies in Lebanon.
