

Dr Samia Ben Sassi is associate professor of neurology at the University Tunis El Manar. She completed her medical studies and her residency in Neurology at the University of Tunis. She had then a fellowship in Neurophysiology at the University Pierre and Marie Curie and trained in Pitié-Salpêtrière and Lariboisière hospitals in Paris. She is also certified in statistical methods and epidemiology and in medical genetics and genomics. Dr Ben Sassi has been involved in the study of neurodegenerative diseases in Tunisia such as muscular dystrophies, hereditary ataxias and Parkinson disease, funded by various national and international agencies such as American Muscular Dystrophy Association (MDA), “Association Française contre les Myopathies “(AFM), Michael J.
