

Jamil Borgi MD, is an Assistant Professor of Clinical Surgery at the American University of Beirut Medical center. After graduating with a medical degree from the American University of Beirut in 2004, he completed three years of General surgery training at AUBMC followed by five year of General Surgery residency at the Henry Ford Hospital/ Wayne State University program. He then completed his fellowship in Cardiothoracic Surgery at the University of Washington in Seattle. In 2014, he was recruited back to Henry Ford Hospital where he started a very busy and complex adult Cardiothoracic Surgery practice. During his time at Henry Ford Hospital, he helped expand the Cardiothoracic Transplant Program to its current state and built a strong referral for complex aortic surgery. His work focuses on advanced cardiac surgery including heart and lung transplantations, Ventricular Assist Devices implantation, and mechanical circulatory support for end stage heart and lung disease. Dr Borgi has a particular interest in aortic and mitral valve repair, surgery for chronic thromboembolic disease, and minimally invasive Cardiothoracic Surgery. He is very active in clinical research, and has presented at multiple international meetings. He has authored numerous peer reviewed papers and a number of book chapters in the field of Cardiothoracic Surgery. He is board certified in both General Surgery and Cardiothoracic Surgery.
