live in Warehouses

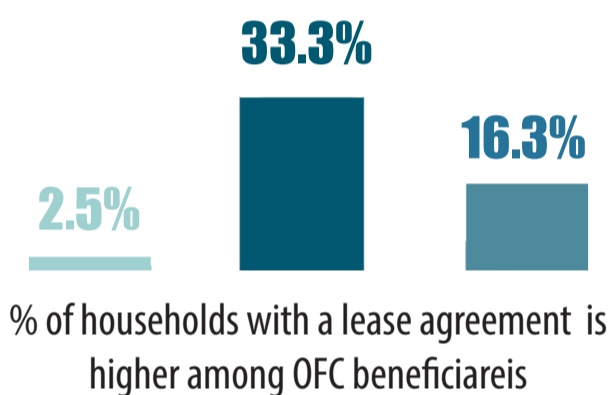

Almost all Syrian refugee households are not aware of their legal rights

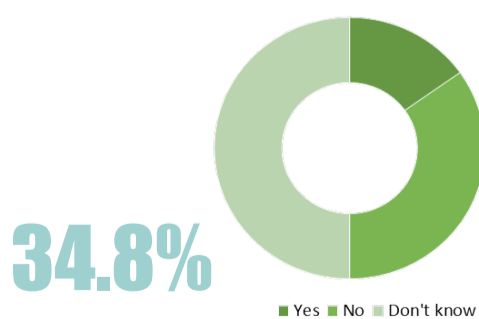


80.4% didn't know how many months their lease agreement covers

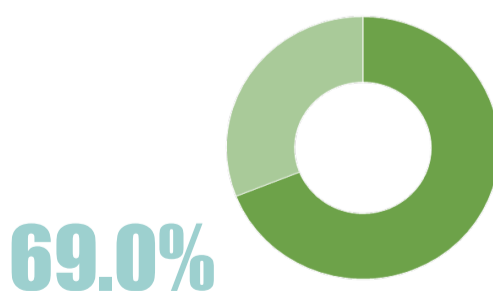


10.6% expected landlord to increase the rent and **57.6%** didn't know if he will

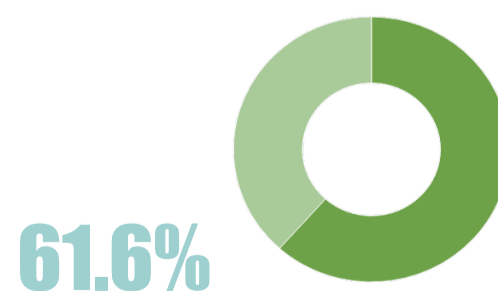
Refugee households faced the end of the OFC shelter modality with apprehension
