Francesco Checchi PhD is a Professor of Epidemiology and International Health at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine. Francesco is an epidemiologist with a career focus on public health in crisis-affected populations, and a mix of experience in research, policy and practice. In addition to several periods spent at the LSHTM, he previously worked for Médecins Sans Frontières, the World Health Organization, and until recently Save the Children, where he led a 30-person humanitarian health team, overseeing technical support to 10-15 responses, including Syria. Francesco has worked on aspects of the transmission and control of several diseases (malaria, African sleeping sickness, TB, pneumonia, cholera, Ebola, malnutrition, vaccine-preventable diseases), but his main area of expertise is field epidemiology and public health information collection and analysis in crisis-affected populations. Francesco has contributed to various WHO and other cross-agency working groups, and in his current academic work collaborates mainly with MSF and WHO.
