Ghassan Hage is the Future Generation Professor of Anthropology and Social Theory at the University of Melbourne, Australia. He has also held many international positions. Throughout the nineties he was associated as a post-doc and then as visiting professor with Pierre Bourdieu's Centre de Sociologie Européenne, École des Hautes Études en Sciences Sociales, Paris. He held visiting professorships at the American University of Beirut, University of Copenhagen, University of Amsterdam, Nanterre and Harvard.

He has written many works in the comparative anthropology of nationalism, racism and multiculturalism, including, most notably: *White Nation; Fantasies of White Supremacy in a Multicultural Society*, 220p, New York: Routledge, 2000 and *Against Paranoid Nationalism: searching for hope in a shrinking society*, Pluto Press: Sydney and Merlin Press: London, 2003.

More recently he published *Alter-Politics: Critical Anthropology and the Radical Imagination*, Melbourne: MUP, 2015. He has a forthcoming book early next year with Polity Press: *Is Racism an environmental threat?* London: Polity (Forthcoming, March 2017). He has also been doing fieldwork with the Lebanese Diaspora across the world for the last twenty five years and is currently finishing an ethnographic monograph on the subject with the provisional title: *The Diasporic Condition*.
