Pam Das graduated in Biochemistry (Bsc [Hons]) in 1991 from Manchester University, UK, followed by a MSc in Applied Molecular Biology in Infectious Diseases at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine (1992-1993). I then went on to complete a PhD (1993-1998) in cellular signalling at the Ludwig Institute for Cancer Research, which is affiliated to University College London, London. I spent a few years working in health writing and journalism. In 2001, I was appointed Senior Editor at The Lancet Infectious Diseases journal, which belongs to The Lancet family of titles. I was involved in setting up the journal and the day-to-day running of it, which included peer review, commissioning, writing, and attending international conferences.

In 2007, I moved over to The Lancet, as an Executive Editor, and then in 2011, I was appointed Senior Executive Editor. The areas I cover are infectious diseases and tropical medicine, public health, global health, and international health policy. I co-lead The Lancet's global health work with the Editor-in-Chief, Richard Horton. I am the lead editor for several of The Lancet's global health Series, special issues, and projects. I oversee peer review, and regularly write editorials and for other sections of the journal. I oversee The Lancet's Comment and News sections, and media operations.
